



Reduced Number of Asthma Attacks Since Lexington Went Smokefree

Since Lexington, Kentucky adopted a smokefree air policy in public places in 2004 it has seen a 22 percent drop in emergency room visits for asthma attacks.



The study, done by the University of Kentucky, looked at four Lexington area hospitals asthma attack visits for the 40 months prior to the passage of the policy and 32 months since.
